# PRIMARY SUMMER BOOKLIST 2023


The tricky thing about making a booklist is that there are just so many books! It's a struggle to make a booklist that is concise enough that it is not too unwieldy but any attempt to do so quickly feels arbitrary and full of omissions. And they keep making new books! Almost as soon as a booklist is published, it feels obsolete with the next arrival of books.

So while a booklist can be helpful, perhaps most important for summer reading is to build a regular and enthusiastic library habit. Your children will delight in having their own library card, an early and forgiving practice in responsibility. We recommend visiting your local branch often, allowing your children to make their own choices, exploring a broad selection of books that they may happily stumble upon on their own accord. Allow your child to make their own choices—even bad choices—as the stakes are low at the library and with experience, your child will learn their own tastes and preferences. And they will have experienced the delicious freedom of the library.

So with all those disclaimers in mind, we have here assembled some favorite books at Arbor—some that have been read repeatedly over the years and are embedded in the culture of school and others that are new but resonate particularly within the Arbor culture—books about friendship and treating each other well, books about the natural world, books about things to make, and books that simply make you laugh.






